Governor Whitmer Unveils MI Healthy Climate Plan

April 21, 2022 - TRAVERSE CITY, Mich. -- Governor Gretchen Whitmer today released the MI Healthy Climate Plan, a roadmap for Michigan to achieve economy-wide carbon neutrality by 2050 with interim 2030 goals. Governor Whitmer joined Liesl Clark, Director of the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE), business owners, tribal leaders, and students at a large solar array in Traverse City to announce the plan. The MI Healthy Climate Plan proposes climate action that would create tens of thousands of clean-energy jobs, spur economic development and innovation, protect clean air and water, and improve public health. The MI Healthy Climate Plan builds off the leadership of tribal communities and cities and town across Michigan, in addition to the private sector.

HB-4705 Presented to Governor Whitmer

On 4-19-2022 <u>HB-4705</u>, which passed concurrently through Senate and House and was presented to Governor Whitmer for signature. The Governor has 14 days to consider the bill. This bill will require every state public body that is a licensing boards, commission panels and rule-making boards to record meetings, unless in closed session.

We will keep you posted on its progress. This is just another way that MIACCA is working hard for our members.

Air Conditioner Manufacturers Announce Price Increases

Many HVAC manufacturers have already announced price increases going into 2022, making headlines as another round of price increases go into effect.

Across the board, we are already seeing manufacturers raise the cost of equipment, parts, and supplies prices. Many manufacturers have made these announcements public, with increases ranging anywhere from 3% up to close to 20%

The reasons for the increases are due to a multitude of factors, including raw material costs, increased labor rates, fuel and transportation costs, and changes to processes.

Some additional considerations for the most recent price increases may include:

- R-410a refrigerant costs are 4x higher than 1 year ago and have limits on availability
- Increased oil and gas prices that impact transportation of heating and cooling products from manufacturers and distribution channels.
- Trans-EuroAsia Logistics (railway) impacted due to conflict in Ukraine & Russia which is affecting resources and goods required for critical components in heating and cooling products.
- Increases in commodities prices and logistics


