Important Citation Implementation Notice from the BCC

MIACCA would like to inform our members of this important Citation Implementation Notice from Keith Lambert, Director of the Bureau of Construction Codes:

August 11, 2020

The Bureau of Construction Codes (BCC) would like to provide you with advance notice that it will begin implementing its authority to issue citations in accordance with MCL 339.553 and MCL 339.5537 to maintain compliance with the Occupational Code, 1980 PA 299, and the Skilled Trades Regulation Act, 2016 PA 407. Individuals licensed/registered as building officials, inspectors, plan reviewers, residential builders, maintenance & alteration contractors, electricians, plumbers, mechanical contractors, and boiler tradesmen may be subject to a citation being issued.

Effective October 1, 2020, a BCC team member may issue a citation to a person that is licensed under 1980 PA 299, or 2016 PA 407, or required to hold a license or certificate under these acts if staff observes from an investigation, inspection, or complaint that conduct or conditions exist or have existed that violate these acts or rules promulgated or orders issued under these acts. Please be advised that citations will not be issued for violations of the code as there are existing remedies to resolve code deficiencies.

MIACCA Submits Written Testimony on Part 9a of the Mechanical Code Changes

On August 27th, the Bureau of Constructions Code held a public hearing on Part 9a of the Mechanical Code changes <u>found here</u>. MIACCA submitted written testimony in regards to not having sealed drawings required for single family dwellings, gas meter piping and a consistent appeals process. SB 827 Senate Reform Hearing September 1, 2020

On September 1st there is a Senate Regulatory Committee hearing (view notice here) on <u>SB</u> 827 which was introduced by Senator Roger Victory. As you know MIACCA reached out to him at the beginning of the year with the bill and we thank him and his staff for their efforts. We believe that this proposed language will allow existing mechanical contractors to appropriately add work classifications to their mechanical licenses; continue the long standing safety practice of having employers attest to an applicant's mechanical work experience; and provide for a reasonable work experience credit for those who goes to school to learn a skilled trade and successfully completes a recognized HVAC trade school, community college, or university program.

MIACCA would like to thank it's members, Roger Mullennix of Williams Distributing, Ken Misiewicz, of Pleune Heating and Cooling and Phil Forner of Allendale Heating Company for their efforts in reaching out to Senators to get this in front of the Senate Regulatory Reform Committee.
